

#### Minister's Letter



It is now 4 years since I was appointed as Interim Moderator and Locum at Ayr:St Quivox.

There has been very little interest shown in the charge and only one applicant who withdrew because he thought the Manse was too small!

We are not alone as the Church of Scotland is in a situation of crisis.

This has been brought about mainly by a change in society where God is now considered by many to be out of date and the Bible message irrelevant to most.

Regrettably the culture within society has infected church attendance as many church members have turned away from the church and neglected the vows they made when they first joined. My view is that many wish to remain on the Communion Roll simply as they see it as a kind of insurance policy, just in case there maybe is a God and Jesus was for real!

We badly need a revival and that revival needs to start from within. I therefore appeal to all members on our Communion Roll to think again about their commitment to our church so that it may continue as an active, vibrant witness in a parish where there is so much spiritual poverty and need.

Most churches are now only in existence because of a faithful few who give of their time, money and talents for the church's work. We are fortunate in St Quivox to have many folk like that!

The Church of Scotland is now looking at ways in which congregations can work together in groups to share resources and encourage one another.

In North Ayr our congregation in St Quivox is grouped with St James Church and Newton Wallacetown Church. Representatives of the three churches meet together frequently to discuss and plan matters of



mutual interest. Recently Session Clerks have met together as have Treasurers.

Meantime in North Ayr our Family/Community Worker, Paul Algeo, is settling in well and doing encouraging work in the three North Ayr Churches.

We must never forget that the Church is not ours but is the Body of Christ in the world.

The victory over evil and death has already been won and those who remain faithful are already on the winning side.

So let us go forward into the remaining days of this year encouraged by that truth and work together for our Lord and Master, Jesus Christ.



1<sup>st</sup> Dalmilling Brownies have had lots of fun and have now completed the 'Be Well' theme and 'Feel Good' badges from the new Girlguiding programme – which is all about knowing how to be healthy. This is the first Theme badge they have earned from the new Girlguiding programme!

To complete the badge we did some more Brownies Unit Activities including one called 'Water Run'. This involved carrying buckets of water from one area to another, and some of the buckets were to have holes in them! However, as it was February it was too wet and cold to go outside, and we somehow thought that it wouldn't be appreciated if we spilt water all over the Halls floor, so we did the



activity using wrapped sweeties instead. This proved far more popular with the Brownies because they got to unwrap and eat the sweeties at the end! We also did some other Unit Activities including learning some fun self-defence boxing moves, and playing a game about safe cycling (rather like 'Simon Says'). For the very last part of the badge we had a 'Mindfulness' evening where

we learnt to be aware of our senses, to listen to our heart beats, and to think of ten things to be grateful for.

We have put some information up on the Notice Board in the Small Hall about our Theme Badge activities – we hope you manage to have a look some time.

In February many of the girls joined Alloway Brownies for a Sleepover – there wasn't a great deal of sleeping, but it was good fun!



We have also managed to pack in some other events - we celebrated World Thinking Day (22<sup>nd</sup> February) by thinking of other members of Girlguiding all over the World, and we learnt all about different forms of communicating. This included Morse Code, sign





language, Makaton signing, and the
Phonetic Alphabet (*Alpha, Bravo, Charlie, Delta etc*)
which the girls used to pass messages to each other on
the Walkie Talkies, and earned an 'On The Air' and
'Communicator' badge. They made necklaces using
pieces of straws and beads to spell out their names in
Morse Code, and decorated a safety

candle to put in their windows to show that they were thinking of others on Thinking Day. The girls were allowed to wear their Brownie uniform to school for Thinking Day which made it an extra special day.



We had another Promise night with the new Brownies making their special Brownie Promise and receiving their precious Brownie Promise badge.

We made bracelets and cards for Mothers' Day. Reverend Yorke joined us for our Easter Party, and we had a delicious tea. We played lots of Easter themed games like *Splat The Egg* (newspaper game similar to *Flap the Fish*), an Egg and Spoon race, and an Easter Bonnet picture hunt game.



We have our Brownie Pack Holiday coming up next month, and to raise some extra funds towards it we did a bag-pack at Asda – the girls were very helpful and polite and had lots of fun raising some much needed funding.

Hopefully we shall have lots of fun at our Pack Holiday – we'll let you know how it went next time!

#### STAMP APPEAL'S 50TH ANNIVERSARY

This year the Stamp Appeal is supporting the Chigodi Women Centre in Blantyre Malawi who are also celebrating their 50th anniversary. The Centre is delivering a broad range of training to address the challenges to women in Malawi. These include tailoring, fashion and chicken farming. By selling the produce made at the centre it is hoped the project can become self sustaining.

We have supported the Stamp Appeal before and it would be good to do so this year. In these times of email, franked mail and charity donations instead of Christmas cards it is harder to collect stamps individually. I will therefore place a box in the churches at Dalmilling and Auchincruive for anyone wishing to participate.
