# Introduction to North Ayr 'TheGither'



My name is Paul Algeo and I've recently been appointed as the Development/Family Worker for the North Ayr 'TheGither' Project. I am extremely thankful for this opportunity and I'm very much looking forward to taking up this role.

I live in Mossblown with my wife, Suzanne. We are both members of New Prestwick Baptist Church and are committed to showing Gods love in a practical way, as well as sharing the Gospel to those we come in to contact with.

We are both involved in running a local charity called 'Wheels in Motion' (WIM). WIM supports people affected by mental health, social isolation and substance misuse issues. We go out on to the streets of Ayr on Thursday evenings. We stop at Wellington Square between 7:45-8:30pm and then Lidl car park at 8:45-9:30. You may have noticed our big red bus...

Prior to starting this role I was a Community Builder working within North Ayr with a project called 'Ahead?' The purpose of this role was to identify opportunities for development in North Ayr and encourage members of the community to use their strengths, skills and passions in an attempt to reduce social isolation.

Due to my previous employment and voluntary experience, I am very familiar with the geographical area in which the North Ayr Churches involved in 'TheGither' project sit in.

My first task is to re-establish the 127 club at Dalmilling Church and explore other opportunities with in that area. I have begun to make plans and I'm trusting God to direct my steps.

1<sup>st</sup> Dalmilling Brownies have been busy continuing working towards the 'Be Well' theme and 'Feel Good' badges from the new Girlguiding programme – which is all about knowing how to be healthy.

We found out how important it is to drink plenty of water throughout the day, and we decorated water bottles to use. We made plaited wool 'Supergirl' necklaces with little slogans attached to remind ourselves of what we are good at, and what we want to achieve in the future. We also learnt how you might be able to keep safe if a strange dog approaches you – fold your arms and look away.





In preparation for the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Remembrance Sunday in November, we sewed beautiful poppy brooches, and we made a special poppy wreath remembering many of the soldiers named on the War Memorial. Some of the Brownies attended the Service

and told the congregation about the soldier they were remembering. And we had an extremely special and memorable moment when Reverend Yorke dedicated and blessed our new Brownie flag during the Service. We joined in with the congregation carrying our flag and our wreath over to the Memorial and laid it with the other wreaths at 11.00am – exactly 100 years since WW1 ended. It was a proud moment for the girls to be part of. After the service, two members of



the congregation approached me to say they had family relatives named on the memorial and they had photographs of the men to show the Brownies. It was very moving to be able to put more faces to the names. We will remember them.



In December we had fun making Christmas crafts, getting very messy gluing Christmas stamps on to tree baubles and sprinkling them with glitter! The following week we had more fun and games at our Christmas party, we sang Christmas carols and played a game called 'Eat The Elf' (throw a 6 on a dice, put on hat, scarf, gloves and sunglasses and try to eat a chocolate

elf using teaspoons to unwrap it ....) followed by the very popular paper snowball fight, and we were very pleased that Reverend Yorke was able to join us for our party tea. After the Christmas holidays we returned to Brownies and found out about the RSPB Garden Birdwatch, and as it was too dark outside we had a go at 'bird watching' indoors using little model birds. We also celebrated Burns Night with Brown Owl's Haggis Dance and ended our meeting by singing Auld Lang Syne.



We have completed the first part of the new badge, and are now half way through completing Part 2.
